CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION MONTH

April is Child Abuse Prevention Month. There are many steps that you can take to protect children in your life from experiencing child abuse. According to the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), child abuse and neglect are complex problems rooted in unhealthy relationships and environments.

Here are 10 ways to help prevent child abuse from Prevent Child Abuse America:

- 1. Be a nurturing parent. Children need to know that they are special, loved, and capable of following their dreams.
- 2. Help a friend, neighbor, or relative. Being a parent isn't easy.
- 3. Help yourself. Life can be challenging, learn strategies to help yourself out of those situations. Don't take it out on your kid.
- 4. If your baby cries, learn what to do if your baby won't stop crying. NEVER shake a babyshaking a child may result in severe injury or death.
- 5. Get involved. Ask your community leaders to develop services to meet the needs of healthy children and families.
- 6. Help to develop parenting resources at your local library.
- 7. Promote programs in school.
- 8. Monitor your child's television, video, and internet viewing/usage.
- 9. Volunteer at a local child abuse prevention program.
- 10. Report suspected abuse or neglect. If you have reason to believe a child has been or may be harmed, call children and family services or the local police department.
